The Achieve Programme:

The Prince's Trust Achieve programme enables students to develop skills in teamwork, characterisation, communication and analysis. The Achieve programme aims to improve the personal and social skills of our students, as well as helping them to understand themselves better, to manage their money and to communicate effectively in a range of personal, social and educational situations. The Achieve programme will cover topics which relate to life skills and personal, social development. The course gives students the opportunity to put what they learn into practice in a variety of contexts.

What will you study during the course?

Modules which are studied include: preparing for a healthy lifestyle, managing money, digital online skills, presentation skills and career planning which will cover writing a CV and interview techniques.

The Achieve Programme is an opportunity for students to develop a variety of skills which are transferable between other subjects at school as well as helping them prepare for the world of work. The Achieve programme is a vocational course with a nationally recognised qualification which students will gain at the end of the course.

How will the course be taught?

A variety of approaches are used to deliver the programme. A variety of teaching methods are used by our experienced staff to deliver the programme, such methods would include discussion based work, independent research, students collaborating by working with a partner and in small groups. Students are issued with a work log booklet for each unit in which they record their progress and log their achievements.

The Achieve programme also provides opportunities for outside speakers to engage with school to deliver workshops to support students through the progress in the different areas of study.

The learning environment is a purposeful, positive environment where students are encouraged to engage positively in all aspects of the course. A variety of learning strategies are used to meet the specific needs of the group so that they are fully prepared to be successful on the Achieve Programme.

How will your work be assessed?

Each unit of work is assessed by staff at Charters and feedback is provided so that students can easily see their progress. The students work is then externally moderated and the units are credited towards the students' final grade.

Where can it lead?

The Achieve programme creating an effective platform for a range of career and study choices as it develops transferable skills such as life skills, creativity, self-confidence, communication, evaluation and teamwork. It will be a very useful tool for students to use on an application for any post 16 courses.
